

We received financial support from an array of sources this year including The New Yankee Stadium Community Benefits Fund, the Ruby Family, and the New York State Extended School Day Violence Prevention Grant. The State Grant was secured through a competitive process to work with children in three high-risk schools in Brownsville, Brooklyn over the next four years.

Thanks to your generous support, we were able to hire and train more facilitators, improve our curriculum with much-needed materials such as yoga mats and celebration journals, and we were able to take our P.S. 184 children to the Whitney Museum for an engaging field trip experience.

On behalf of the Board of Directors and myself, we thank you for your continued support that allows Green Generations to thrive. We look forward to celebrating future success with our GG family and friends.


Ethical Leadership Projects

A pillar of Green Generations's mission is to empower children with ethical leadership skills. To accomplish our goal, we design leadership projects every year with the children who have successfully completed our emotional-health curriculum.



In 2016, our Green Generations children made a huge impact. Our Green Generations children at Girls Prep Charter Elementary School and P.S.5 in the Bronx participated in *Kids for COP21* (details below), studied about the plight of the bonobos in the Congo and fundraised \$25 for the organization Lola Ya Bonobo, and created and facilitated a Powerpoint presentation to their families and school administrators on inspiring ethical leaders around the world - both young and old.

It was truly an empowering and momentous year for our ethical Green Generations leaders.





Kids for COP21

The most powerful call to action on climate change can come from young people.

Green Generations believes children and effect social change at any age and values the importance of teaching them ethical leadership skills. As such, Kids for COP21 was an opportunity to give children a voice to speak to delegates traveling to Paris, France for the COP21 climate change talks.

Green Generations children participated by sending their messages to world leaders through artwork, letters, and videotaped messages. While there is still much to be done, each delegate received a printed journal including all of the children's messages and letters representing nine countries.
